## Housing & Basic Needs

The Leamington Support Centre-Housing and Supports

The Leamington Support Centre hosts a variety of different programs and workers. This includes two Housing Response Workers, a Service Coordinator, and a Youth-In Transition Worker.

Our Service Coordinator is the first person point of contact when individuals are experiencing housing instability. She aids individuals in searching for sustainable, affordable, and safe housing options. In addition, she provides adequate referrals and systems navigation to ensure all their immediate needs are being met. She is currently working with approximately 90 individuals on a monthly basis.

Our Housing Reponses Workers pro-

vide long-term intensive supports to persons who have higher needs. These workers are a linkage the Windsor-Essex Housing Connections, which is a multi-agency partnership that is compiled of the following agencies; ACCESS, The Downtown Mission, Housing Information Services, Family Services Windsor-Essex, and the Can-Am Indian Friendship Centre. The individuals they support are experiencing homelessness, addictions and in combination with mental health illnesses. A snapshot of housing support successes are; One youth who had successfully applied and was accepted to a local college. Another individual who had been experiencing homelessness for six months, had been able to secure housing late last month. A client was given assistance with navi-

gating the housing stability track which resulted in them obtaining a permanent, affordable, and welcomed housing solution

The Youth-In-Transition Role works alongside youth that are aging out of the Children's Aid Society's care. This staff person helps individuals find their way to full-independence. Each client is completely unique and holds tremendous opportunity for growth. This client directed program helps support youth in tapping into their potential and reach their self- identified goals. Some of the recent successes of these youth are:

Participating in a CTV interview that is helping bring awareness to gaps in youth focused services in Leamington, and promoting the development of the Building Bridges youth hub. Aiding two at-risk youths search and connect with landlords, and secure their own housing
